Problem Statement

In China, administrative corruptions are deemed due to most serious governance problems of CCP (Chinese Communist Party) government. Pervading corruptions in many governmental sectors have caused great loss in economy and society, as well as the international image of the country. Land administrative corruption, due to the extensive connections of land resource with all the sectors in the society, is one of the most significant corruption activities now-a-days.

- Economic, social and psychological factors are very important factors that could influence the officials' actual corruptive behaviors.

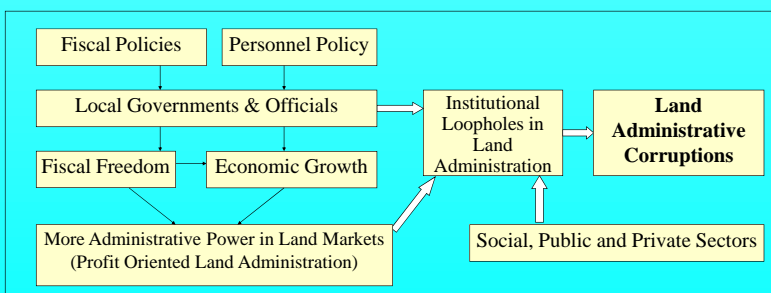
Research Methodology

Key Findings

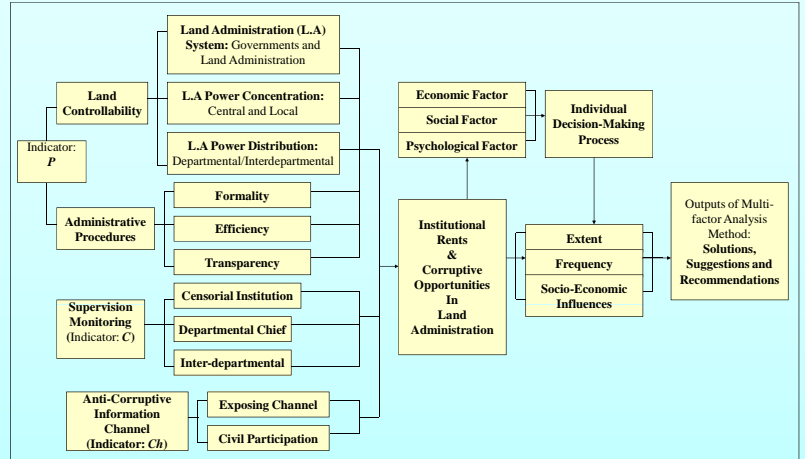
Based on the multi-factor analysis results, the thesis identified a series of institutional reforms and development measures focusing on both direct and indirect effects of anti-corruption policies.

Motivators of Land Administrative Corruptions



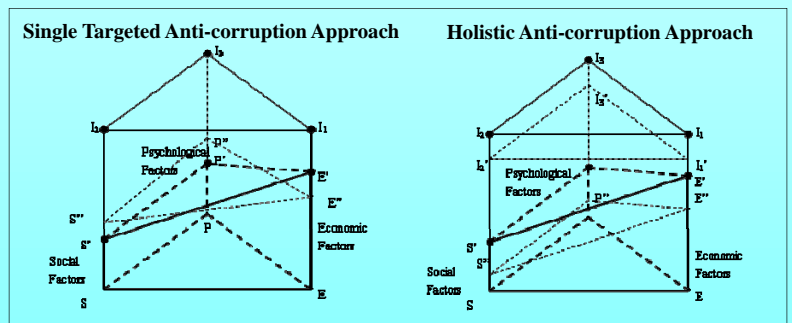
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Multi-factor Analysis Framework



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Corruption Prism Model Comparison

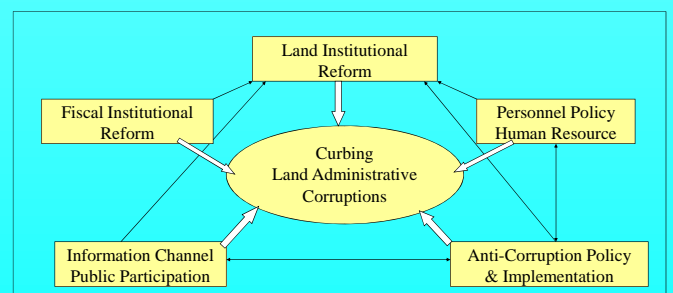


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Recommendations
